Big Question

How did Jesus save the world?

Choose questions for your small group.

1. What stood out to you the most from the message? What's one thing you learned?
2. What were some of the ways Jesus surprised the people who were waiting for a savior? *Ideas: He came as a poor baby to a small town; He was a carpenter, not a warrior; He showed mercy and grace, not vengeance; etc.)*
3. Read **Romans 6:23 NLT**. How does this verse describe a win-win situation? *Ideas: We need a savior and we get one! We can't possibly earn it, but we still get forgiveness and eternal life if we ask for it!*
4. What's your answer to today's big question? *Printed above. Ideas: He gave His perfect life for us to make us right with God, so anyone who accepts His free gift of eternal life with Him can be saved!*
5. How does it make you feel to know that no matter what you do—including if you actually hated God—He still loves you?
6. What do you think is great about Jesus and what He did for everyone?
7. Pray together. Pray that your students would be filled with the joy and peace that comes from accepting God's love and grace toward them. Pray they would walk in grace and freedom every day of their lives.
